# About EUSA

## ABOUT EUSA

The European University Sports Association (EUSA) is a non-profit organisation of the national university sports federations in Europe. It is recognised as the governing body in this field by the International University Sports Federation (FISU), European Commission and other institutions.

EUSA was founded in November 1999 in Vienna, Austria by 25 national federations. Today it counts 45 national federations, and is governed by the Executive Committee, composed by 15 elected members and 2 non-voting members. Furthermore, several commissions are put in place to carry out the work, supported by the EUSA staff.

Sport events in EUSA started with the European Universities Championships in 2001, including only two sports (Basketball and Volleyball). In 2015 already 19 sports are featured in its core framework and the events are organised throughout Europe.

## MISSION

EUSA is dedicated to providing European students with unique experience, combining sports participation with culture, education and socialisation, while encouraging them to pursue their academic degree, promoting also the notion of dual career. Participants are treated with respect through the opportunity to experience growth in the areas of interacting with others, teamwork, sportsmanship, fair play and skills development. The goal is to create a positive environment that fosters improved self-confidence and self-esteem through experiences in sports activities and celebrates the symbolic and friendly cooperation between all European Universities/ students and to add value to the concept of student sport by associating it with culture, environment, sustainable development and combine the EUSA events into a memorable gathering of athletes, students, professors and fans.

## EUSA IN NUMBERS

EUSA, together with the organisers of EUSA-governed events (Games & Championships) provides valuable team and social experiences for the increasing population of public & private-schooled youth - higher education students. EUSA offers young people the opportunity to participate in a variety of individual and team sports throughout the calendar year and engaging them in numerous projects and social responsibility activities.

- 1 EUSA serves the extended European region with a total student population in excess of 3.000.000 people.
- 2 EUSA nowadays has 45 member federations with over 4.000 Universities and more than 4.5 million students active in university sports.
- 3 Among EUSA participants, 40% are women and 60% men. These percentages may change due to trends in choice of sports, other alternatives offered in the market place and other factors impacting participation and availability of these experiences.
- 4 An estimated number of 500.000 students between the age of 17 and 30 years are potential EUSA participants. If in average every student has a minimum of 10 friends at the university this means at least 5 million people in student community are interested in sports activities and results.

### MORE THAN SPORT

European University Sports Association participates in partner projects and also carries out its own projects and initiatives. Here is a short overview of the recent projects:

- **European Anti-Doping Initiative (EADIn)**

EADIn promotes healthy sports participation, without drugs. A peer to peer network of Anti-Doping Junior Ambassador was established, having several activities carried out throughout Europe.

- **European Voluntary Service (EVS)**

EUSA is an accredited organisation in the European Commission's programme of European Voluntary Service. Through EVS we help young people to gain experiences in long-term working activities.

- **Prevention of Sexualised Violence in Sports**

Projects "Impulses for an open, secure and sound sporting environment in Europe" and "Voices for truth and dignity" aims to sensitise and raise awareness about the prevention of sexualised violence on all levels.

- **Sport Employs YOUrope**

Together with the partners network we raise awareness about the experiences gained in sport, promoting and enhancing youth employment and entrepreneurship in and through sport.

- **Equal Opportunities**

All our events are for men and women, we promote gender equality, inclusion of students with impairments and disabilities and we also carry out a special development programme.

- **EUSA Photo Competition**

We organise an annual Photo Competition, where participants are encouraged to take photos, sharing their moments and activating wider audience in participating beyond sport.

- **EUSA Volunteer Exchange Programme**

In cooperation with the Organising Committees of EUSA sporting events, we offer students from Europe a unique opportunity of actively participating in short-term activities, during the sports events.

- **Exhibition on University Sport in Europe**

Supported by the International University Sports Federation (FISU), a travelling exhibition about the history and development of University Sport in Europe has been set up, promoting values of student sport.

# General Info about EUSA EUG

## PHILOSOPHY

European Universities Games is a multi-sport university sports competition governed by the European University Sports Association (EUSA). Participants in these events are European university teams and individuals.

The Games are organised on a biannual basis, starting with 2012, with European Universities Championships being organised in even years as the individual events. The Games as such represent the largest European multisport student event, celebrating university sport, promoting the principles of fair play, diversity and inclusion. Events encompass sports, social, educational and cultural activities, bringing people from different ethnical, cultural and geographical backgrounds together.

## PAST EVENTS

EUSA flagship event – the European Universities Games – was organised for the first time in 2012, hosted in Cordoba, Spain. The event was very successful, with over 2500 participants, featuring 10 sports. Rotterdam was the host city of the 2nd European Universities Games in 2014, bringing together 2828 participants from 269 university teams, representing 174 universities from 35 countries in Europe. The Games included a wide range of competitions in 10 different sports and a rich cultural, educational and social programme. After Zagreb- Rijeka, the next European Universities Games will be held in 2018 in Coimbra (Portugal) and in 2020 in Belgrade (Serbia).

Situated in South East Europe, in a region lapped by the waves of the Mediterranean Croatia has always been a country of interesting intertwinement of central European and Mediterranean cultural circles.

Croatia borders Slovenia and Hungary to the north, Serbia to the east, Bosnia and Herzegovina and Montenegro to the southeast. The country also has a long maritime border with Italy in the Adriatic Sea.

According to UNESCO, Croatia is a country with the greatest number of protected cultural phenomena in Europe. This is thanks to its natural-geographical diversity, as well as its specific historical uniqueness. These natural assets greatly impact the development of tourism, social and cultural life. Therefore, today, Croatia represents one of the tourist







superpowers of the Mediterranean which is evident by the continual increase in the number of tourists visiting the country. A warm sea, deeply drawn into the European continent, Mediterranean climate, contemporary motorways and a favourable geo-transit position, are only some of the reasons why many foreign tourists and world renowned tourism magazine publishers consider Croatia the most desirable tourist destination.

**Croatia is a country that loves and understands sport**

Croatia, with only 4.5 million inhabitants, achieved its recognition

in the world through major sporting accomplishments of top athletes – Davor Suker (football), Drazen Petrovic (basketball), Goran Ivanisevic (tennis), Janica and Ivica Kostelic (skiing), Blanka Vlasic (athletics) and many others.

Croatia has hosted many major European and international sport events in the last 20 years. The sport events that Croatia hosts are always organized with great care, attention and the highest levels of professionalism as this nation, small by number, is aware that only a great and brave heart can achieve important results.







## About Zagreb



### ZAGREB – CITY WITH A MILLION HEARTS

The city of Zagreb, capital of Croatia, on the historic and political threshold between East and West, illustrates both the continental and Mediterranean spirit of the nation it spearheads. Zagreb is the cultural, scientific, economic, political and administrative centre of the country. The facades of Zagreb's buildings reflect the ebb and flow of history, while its streets and squares bear witness to the coming together of the many cultures that have shaped the identity of this laid-back capital. But the greatest value of this city is the atmosphere and the people you meet here, that is why we can say Zagreb has a story with million hearts.

Zagreb has culture, arts, music, architecture, gastronomy and all the other things that make a quality capital city. Croatia's coastal attractions aside, Zagreb has finally been discovered as a popular city-break destination in

its own right. Spacious squares and monuments among the many parks and green spaces proudly testify to the thousands of years of history and comprise the appearance of present-day Zagreb.

If you want to get to the roots of the city, head to the medieval Gornji Grad, Zagreb's Upper Town. The splendid cobblestone streets and red tiled roofs of the buildings, make a beautiful place to begin an interesting and pleasant trip through history and present, while discovering many of the city's most visited attractions, including the Kaptol Square, notable

for the Cathedral and its many early 17th-century buildings, the famous stone gate, parliament building, St. Mark's Church and numerous museums and churches.

The heart of the city and a meeting point for all Zagreb citizens is the main square of Ban Josip Jelacic. Just a few steps from the main square starts the Ilica, the longest and busiest street of Zagreb, which divides the old and romantic Upper Town (Gornji grad) from the younger and always busy Lower town (Donji grad). The

shortest link between the Upper and Lower town is the funicular, another recognizable Zagreb postcard image. Another feature of the city are its open-air food markets. Almost every neighbourhood has one, but the Dolac, near the Cathedral, is the best known. If you want to experience Zagreb at its most relaxed, you should head to Tkalciceva Street, lined with cafés, bars and restaurants, a beloved meeting place of the citizens of Zagreb and any visitor just passing through. Preradovic Square, also known as



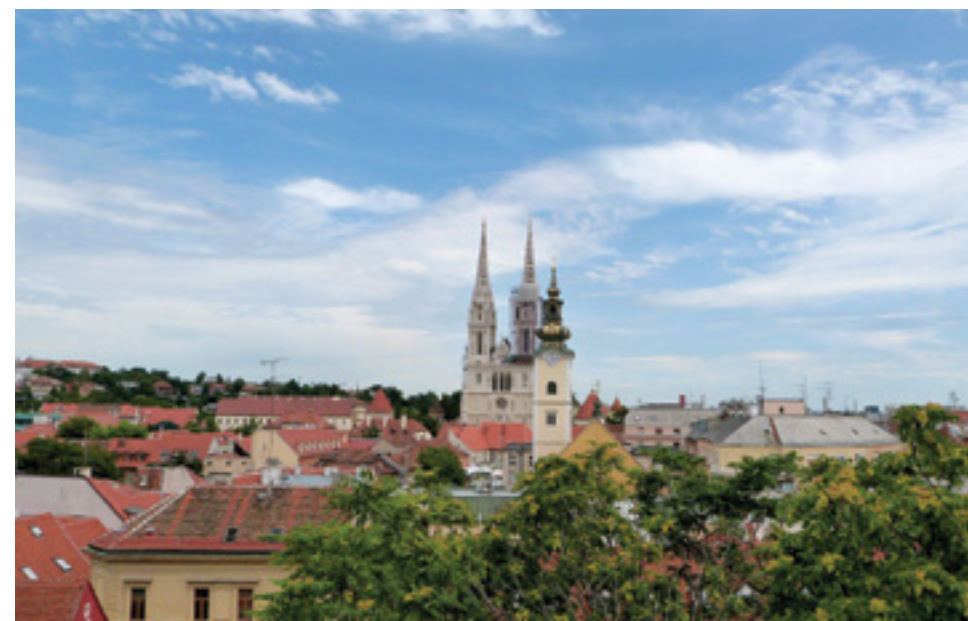


Flower Square is also a popular place to get a cup of coffee, relax or have a business meeting. Other highlights include the monument to King Tomislav near the main railway station, the Croatian National Theatre as another key symbol of Zagreb.

The history, art and culture of Zagreb, Croatia and Europe are reflected in the architecture around the city, as well as in its varied theatres, museums, large number of galleries and many and many theatre, music and dance festivals all combine to make Zagreb a city of art. These different artistic outlets reflect the high level of cultural awareness and rich cultural life of the city.



Zagreb is the city of parks, many are now officially part of Croatian cultural heritage list. The Botanical garden is a must to visit, as well as the biggest park, Maksimir. Outside the limits of the city centre, up on the hill, stands the main cemetery of Mirogoj. Its monumental arcades, pavilions and domes were designed in the late 19th century making it one of the most beautiful cemeteries in Europe and the resting place for many public figures. For those who are looking for a place for outings, we suggest Sljeme (1035 m) the highest peak of Medvednica Mountain, which holds a special place in the hearts of the people of Zagreb.







### ZAGREB – CITY OF SPORT

The people of Zagreb have always been passionate about sport. Beside the professional sport clubs, such as the Dinamo football club and Cibona basketball club, other centers for recreation can be found around the city. In addition, what used to be a branch of the Sava River is now the Jarun Recreational Sports Centre, built for the 1987 Universiade. There you'll find cycle paths, footpaths and sports courts for everyone to use. In summer, Jarun is referred to as the Zagreb Sea, as its beaches fill with sun worshippers, as there is also a small patch of undisturbed nature.

**The University of Zagreb is  
the oldest Croatian University  
and also the oldest university  
in South East Europe**

It was officially founded on September 23rd, 1669 by Emperor and King Leopold I Habsburg who issued a decree granting the status and privileges of a University to the Jesuit Academy of the Royal Free City of Zagreb. Bishop Josip Juraj Strossmayer in 1861 proposed to the Croatian Parliament that a legal basis will be established for the founding of the University of Zagreb. In 1869 the Emperor Franz Joseph signed

the Decree on the Establishment of the University of Zagreb. Five years later the Parliament passed the Act of Founding, which was ratified by the Emperor on January 5th, 1874. On October 19th, 1874 a ceremony was held in the name of the establishing of the modern University of Zagreb.

Today, it is the most academically diverse and comprehensive university in Croatia, well-integrated into European and international academic systems. With the ratio of 80% of scientific productivity of all Croatian universities it is by far the leading research institution

in Croatia. The central strategic decision of the future development of the University of Zagreb is to be a research oriented institution with high quality teaching. Accordingly, the focus will be on masters and doctoral programs, encompassing all fields of science and art, boosting transdisciplinary and interdisciplinary studies, as well as nurturing the culture of innovation and transfer of knowledge. This should result in better intersectoral harmonisation in local and regional levels.







## About Rijeka



Rijeka is the principal seaport and the third-largest city in Croatia. It is located on Kvarner Bay, an inlet of the Adriatic Sea and has a population of 200,000 inhabitants. The word "Rijeka" means river in Croatian, likewise the Italian name for the city – Fiume.

Over the centuries various European powers gained influence over Rijeka and its surroundings: the Austrians, French, Italians, Hungarians and Venetians – apart from the Croats. Each left its mark. One of the most influential for the development of the city was the Austrian period. Much of the architecture of the city is reminiscent of Central Europe since it was built by the same people. Under the Hapsburgs, Rijeka was connected to Vienna and Budapest by road and rail, and proclaimed a free port. These transport links contributed massively to the development of Rijeka as an industrial city since second half of the 18th century. The city's fortunes shifted as it changed hands, but after

reintegration into Croatia after the Second World War, it became one of the driving forces of the economy and is now the third biggest city in the republic after Zagreb and Split.

As the capital of Kvarner, Rijeka offers its visitors a variety of cultural events, concerts and culinary experiences throughout the entire year. Although known for its natural beauty, there are various sports related activities and well-known services related to health and wellness on offer too.

Rijeka, exposed to the wide world for so many years now, is

cosmopolitan in outlook and young in spirit - you can feel it as you walk along the elegant Korzo, the main pedestrian street in the very heart of the town. Lined by elegant period buildings, shops and cafés, interspersed with refreshing fountains, this is where the locals gather by day to catch up on the latest news and to enjoy a promenade. Walking along Korzo, you can get to know the history of the city, the forward-looking people and their culture. Near the Jadranski trg is a fine yellow building,

the City Tower, one of the symbols of the city. This was once a gate which lead into the fortified town from the sea. Architecture enthusiasts should definitely visit the National Theatre, which is one of the proofs that Rijeka is where Central Europe meets the Mediterranean. One of the best known symbols of the city is the Trsat Castle, a strategically placed lookout situated on a 138 m high hill, overlooking the harbour area and keeping watch over the hinterland is the fortress Trsat, which has stood guard over the city





since Illyrian times. Trsat is a complex comprising the fortress and church, a Franciscan monastery, a smaller church, a sports hall and exhibition centre (where many concerts are held), landscaped park gardens and a charming huddle of houses. Also, don't forget to take a walk to the St Vitus Cathedral dedicated to the patron saint and protector of Rijeka.

You can enjoy the view of the Kvarner islands and the green Učka mountain peaks as you travel towards the captivating town of Opatija, where you might find the aura of the European aristocracy and timeless elegance quite appealing.

Discover the charms of the islands – each one so different, but all surrounded by sparkling sea and a climate that returns to you the life that the hectic pace we live by robs us of day by day.

**STUDENT SPORT IN CROATIA**

Since July 7, 1993 CASF is a member of the Federation Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU) - a worldwide organization of student sports, and since December 1, 2001 member of the European University Sports Federation (EUSA) – the European organization of student sports.

Croatian Academic Sports Federation (CASF) is the umbrella organization of student sport movement in Croatia. The Federation has 19 members and organizes sport and sport related activities for around 180,000 students from all higher education institutions in the Republic of Croatia. That makes it one of the largest and fastest growing sports organizations in Croatia. Around 80 employees are dedicated to the development of student sport in Croatia. These employees are mostly teachers of physical education and professional heads of sport activities at Croatian universities.

Every year, members of CASF organize a series of events and competitions:

- Unisport Finals - a national sports event which gathers more than 2500 student athletes in 22 sports
- Students Sport Day - organized every year in several Croatian cities bringing together more than 5000 students
- International Rowing Regatta Sv. Duje - organised every year in Split, Croatia with more than 500 participants
- Conferences, seminars and workshops with more than 3000 participants

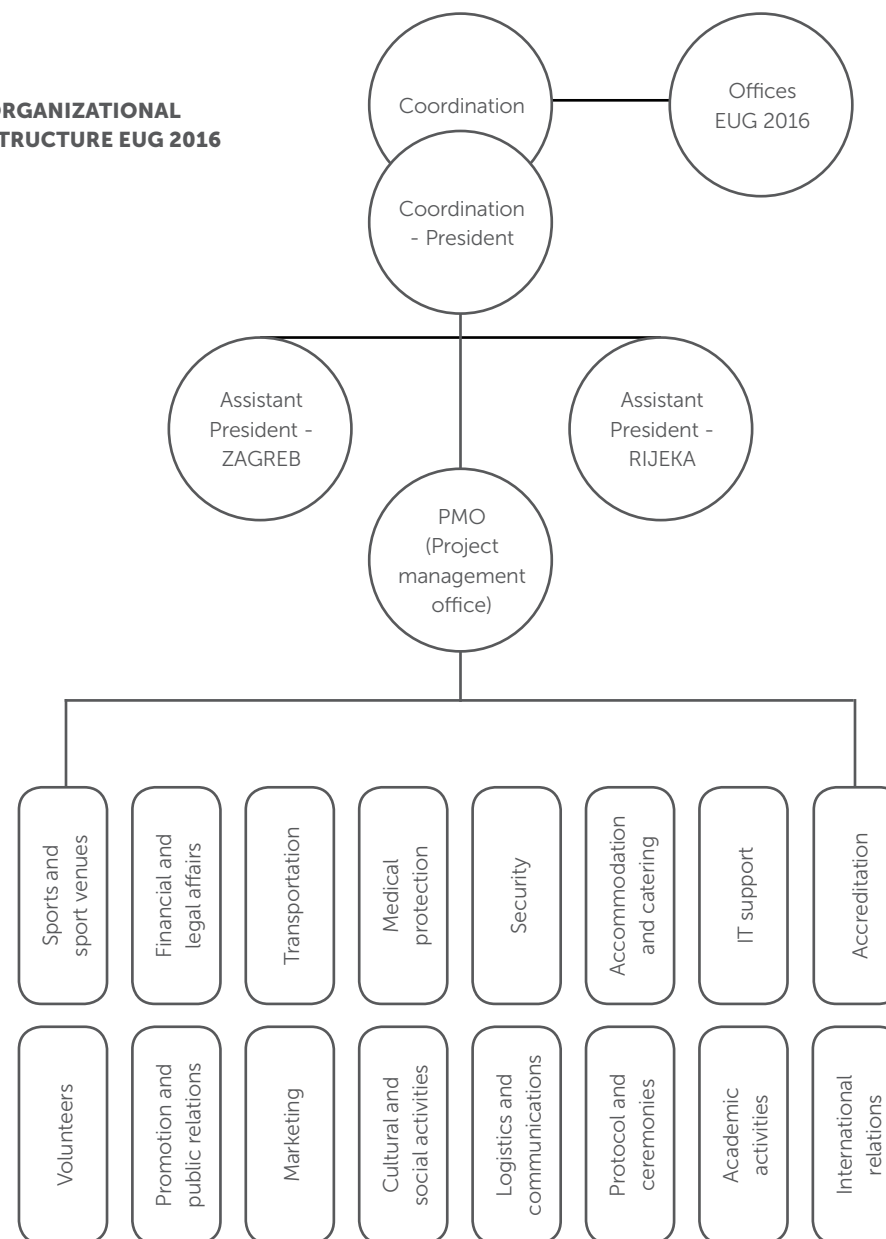
## SCAC and OC structure

SCAC is the highest authority of the EUG and controls overall organizational and technical aspects of the EUG. The SCAC is responsible for the interpretation of EUSA Regulations, for the supervision and smooth running of the EUG, settling any dispute, examining and dealing with any complaints or protests of a non-technical nature, taking emergency sanctions against participants (teams or individuals) who violate the EUSA Regulations, deciding of any other matters not covered in these Regulations, at the time of the EUG.

The SCAC is composed by: SVC members, OC Chair, OC Sport Director and two (2) other representatives; lead by SVC Chair. The mandate of the SCAC members terminates with the conclusion of the EUG.

SCAC Members shall cooperate in a way to find compromise by taking decision unanimously. In case of voting, decisions will be taken by a simple majority of those present and voting. In case of equality of votes, the SCAC Chair shall have a casting vote. All decisions taken by the SCAC at the time of the EUG are final.

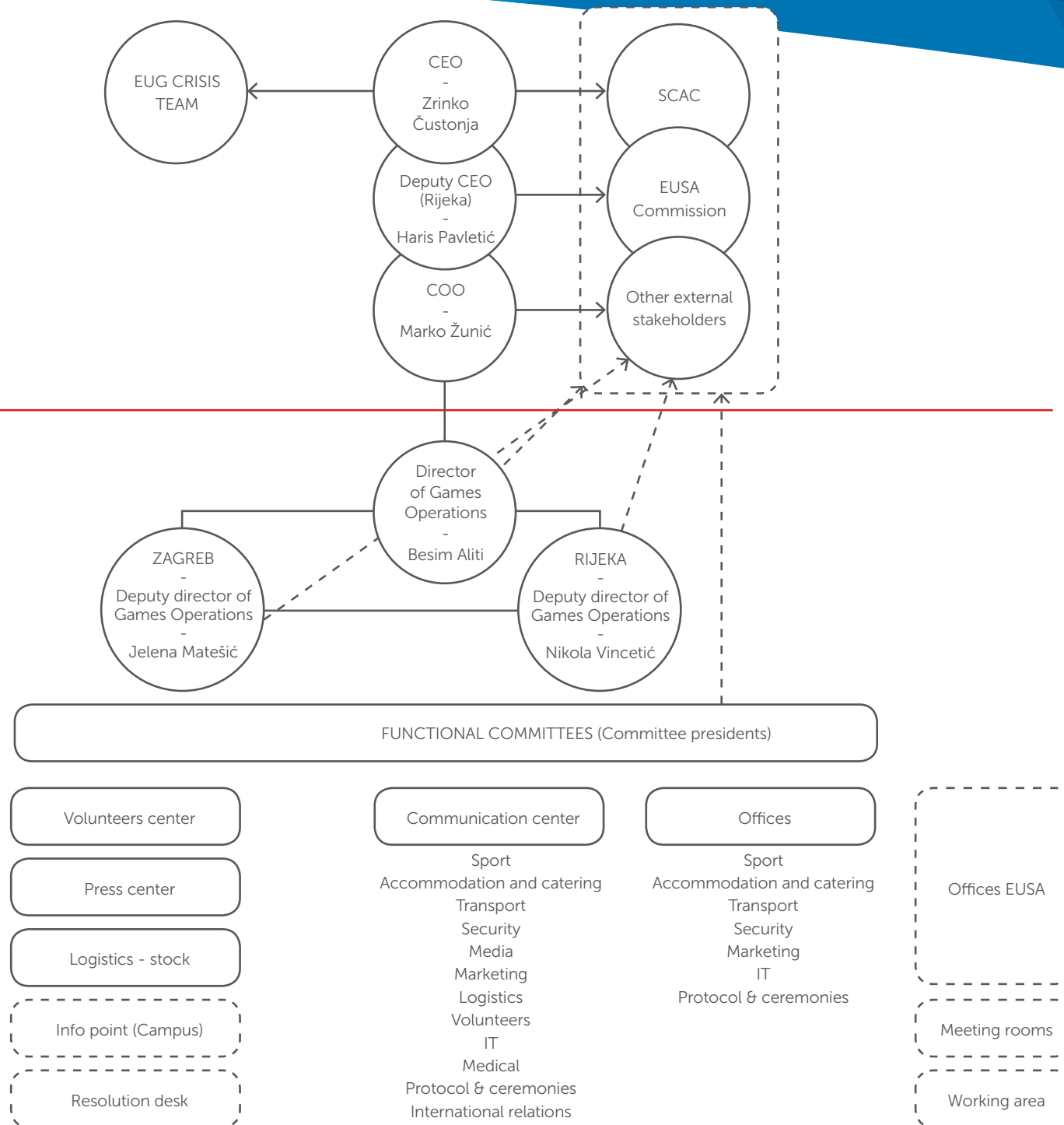




## ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE DURING THE GAMES

# Visa Procedure

## European Universities Games Zagreb-Rijeka 2016

Zagreb, Rijeka 12 – 25 July 2016  
VISA APPLICATION PROCEDURE

### 1. WHO NEEDS CROATIAN VISA?

All participants are required to check the website of the Ministry of Foreign and European Affairs of Croatia <http://www.mvep.hr/en/consular-information/visas/visa-requirements-overview/> to check if they require a visa for Croatia. Please note that all EU citizen can travel to Croatia with a valid ID or a valid passport and do not need a visa.



### 2. EXEMPTIONS:

#### A. SCHENGEN, BULGARIAN, CYPRIOT, AND ROMANIAN VISAS AND RESIDENCE PERMITS

All participants who are holders of valid Schengen documents (uniform visa C for two (2) or multiple (MULTI) entries, residence permit), as well as national visas and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus, and Romania do not require an additional (Croatian) visa for Croatia.

Participants who are holders of the following documents do not require a visa for Croatia:

- uniform visa (C) for two (2) or multiple (MULT) entries, valid for all Schengen Area Member States;
- visa with limited territorial validity (LTV visa), for two or multiple entries, issued to the holder of a travel document that is not recognized by one or more, but not all of the Schengen Area Member States, and which is valid for the territory of the Member States recognizing the travel document;
- long-stay visa (D) for stays

exceeding three months, issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;

- residence permit issued by one of the Schengen Area Member State;
- national visas for two or multiple entries and residence permits of Bulgaria, Cyprus and Romania listed in Annex I, Annex III and Annex IV of the Decision No 565/2014/EU.

The Decision No 565/2014/EU is available at: <http://eur-lex.europa.eu/legal-content/EN/TXT/PDF/?uri=CELEX:32014D0565&from=EN>.

The period of validity of the above mentioned Schengen, Bulgarian, Cypriot, and Romanian documents must cover the duration of stay and still be valid at the moment of leaving Croatia. Please note that Schengen visa of type C or Bulgarian, Cypriot, or Romanian visa valid for single entrance only does not exempt you from Croatian visa. Please note that holders of UK and Irish visas or residence permits are not exempted from Croatian visa.

#### B. DIPLOMATIC, SERVICE AND SPECIAL PASSPORTS

Holders of valid diplomatic and service passports of the following states do not require a visa for Croatia: Armenia, Bolivia, China, Columbia, Cuba, Georgia, India, Indonesia, Iran, Kazakhstan, Kosovo, Moldova, Oman, Peru, Philippines, Qatar, Russia, South Africa, Thailand, Tunisia, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, Vietnam.

Holders of valid diplomatic, service and special passports of the following countries do not require a visa for Croatia: Egypt, Morocco, Turkey. Holders of valid diplomatic passports of the following countries do not require a visa for Croatia: Algeria, Jordan.

All participants are required to check if they need a visa for Croatia. If you do not hold one of the above mentioned documents, you have to apply for a Croatian visa!



### 3. WHERE TO APPLY FOR CROATIAN VISA?

Regarding visa procedure process, as a general rule, aliens who require a visa have to appear in person at least once at the nearest Croatian Embassy in his/her area of residence earliest three months before the planned visit.

The requirement of personal appearance may be waived if the application is submitted via official diplomatic channel accompanied by a verbal note of the respected Embassy or the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of his/her country of origin.

If there is no Croatian Embassy/ Consular Office of the Republic of Croatia please contact the nearest Croatian diplomatic mission regarding the possibility of submitting your visa application via Honorary Consul of the Republic of Croatia or by post/e-mail.

However, bear in mind that should you arrange with our diplomatic mission to submit your

documents by post/e-mail, you would need to appear in person at one of our Embassies as well as bring original documents.

Applicants can also fill out the visa application form on-line at [crovisa.mvep.hr](http://crovisa.mvep.hr) (available in English, Russian, Ukrainian, Albanian, and Turkish language). Printed and filled out application form along with other required documents should be submitted to the competent Croatian Embassy/Consulate or visa centre.

Visa applications can also be submitted at VFS Visa Application Centres in: Algeria, Belarus, China, Egypt, Philippines, Georgia, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Qatar, Kuwait, Morocco, Nigeria, South Africa, Oman, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Thailand, Turkey, United Arab Emirates, Ukraine, and Vietnam. ### 4. WHICH DOCUMENTS NEED TO BE SUBMITTED WHEN APPLYING FOR CROATIAN VISA?

The following documents need to be enclosed (presented) with the application:

1. Filled-in and signed visa application form: <http://www.mvep.hr/en/consular-information/visas/forms/visa-application/> or online visa application form: <https://crovisa.mvep.hr/>
2. A valid travel document: the period of validity of the travel document should exceed that of the visa's by three (3) months, it must include at least two empty pages and must be issued in the preceding 10 years;
3. A colour photograph (35 x 45 mm);
4. Invitation Letter by the organizer - European Universities Games Zagreb-Rijeka 2016
5. Tourist voucher or reservation of accommodation: only if you are planning an additional stay in Croatia for the purpose of tourism before or after the Games
6. Means of transport (reservation of the return flight ticket);
7. Proof of paid visa fee
8. Valid travel health insurance: has to be valid for the Republic of Croatia for the whole duration of your stay, and the lowest sum insured must be equivalent to 30,000 EUR.

Please make all preparations on time in order to leave enough time to the competent authorities of the Republic of Croatia to process your visa applications in accordance with the Croatian and the EU legislation!

## Overview

Throughout 15 days in July 2016, 5700 participants from 41 European countries and around 400 Universities will compete in 21 different sports and will be part of the most beautiful sports story ever told in Croatia!

**Zagreb holds a long tradition in culture and sports, while Rijeka is the multicultural centre of the Mediterranean. Adding the Croatian hospitality, these cities are reasons enough to visit Croatia!**



European Universities Games represent the largest multi-sport event in the European university sport under the umbrella of European Universities Sports Association (EUSA). So far, EUG has been held twice (Cordoba 2012 and Rotterdam 2014), while the following EUG 2016 will be held in Zagreb and Rijeka, with a support of the Croatian Academic Sports Federation (CASF). The Games are opened for all student athletes representing their Universities or other institutions at the highest level of education. The organizational goal of EUG 2016 is to prepare the biggest Games so far, initiating a turning point in European university sport and contributing to all future editions of this event. The EUG 2016 Organizing Committee (small in numbers, but big on hard work and sports passion) is working day and night to prepare all the best conditions for the Games! The OC also thought of student's life quality, providing newly regulated system of university sports, as well as renovated and new accommodation



facilities. This will significantly raise the standard of student's accommodation, along with reconstructed sports venues available for the whole community.

Our inspiration is our tradition. The first student sports club was founded 112 years ago at the University of Zagreb. The Federation of Academic Sports Clubs at the University of Zagreb was founded 92 years ago. Mandatory physical education classes were introduced in Croatian universities 52 years ago. Twenty-eight years ago the first University Games, also known as Universiade was organized in Zagreb. The Croatian Academic Sports Federation was founded 22 years ago.

### VERBAL IDENTITY

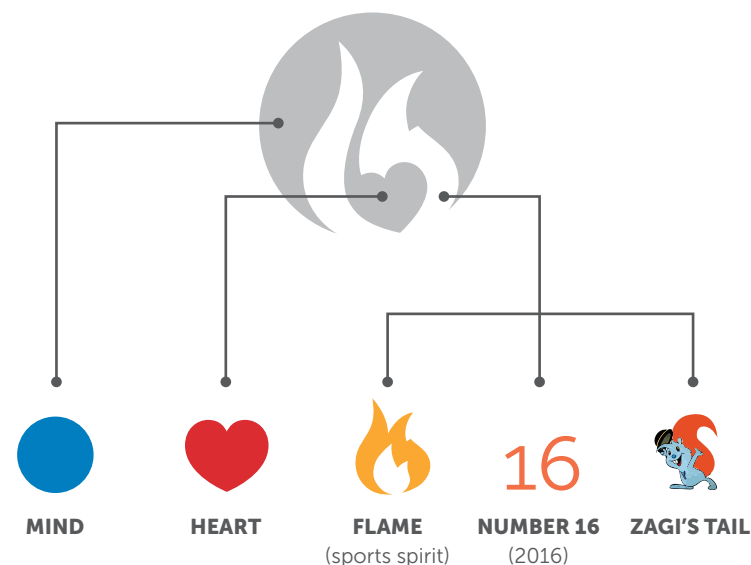
The concept of dualism and synergy of the heart and mind, promote all the key values that student sports represent: ratio, education, prudence, strength, energy, fighting spirit and love – characteristics that help young people achieve excellence in their academic and athletic lives.

The slogan also rests on the concepts of faith as a motivator, and achievement as a result of the

successful sports activity. Both concepts represent important elements of sports – faith in one self and one's own capabilities, faith in victory, the achievement of results, the worthiness of persistence and invested effort.

The idea of dualism is also integrated in the very proposal of the dual candidature of Zagreb and Rijeka.

### VISUAL IDENTITY

Embodies the verbal identity aspect by incorporating the symbol of the heart (shape, red colour) and mind (circle, blue colour). It also embodies a number of other symbols which have an exceptional importance for the candidature of Zagreb and Rijeka:

Colours – red, white and blue are the representative colours of Croatian national symbols. Red is the colour of Rijeka, while blue is the representative colour of Zagreb.

Shapes – white shapes (inside the blue circle) symbolize the number 16 (year of the Games – 2016). Furthermore, these shapes denote the silhouette of "Zagi" (the exceptionally popular mascot of the Zagreb Universiade from 1987), and in the combination with the red colour of the heart portrays a flame as the symbol of the sporting and Olympic spirit.





### THE MASCOT HRKI

The concept of the mascot is based on the idea: 'It is important to participate' and a cute and small hamster is the perfect embodiment of this idea. This animal is known for its specific way of having fun – running. Our hamster is not so muscular, but it does not stop him to do sports. The most important thing for him is to socialize, have fun and participate. That makes him a winner regardless of the outcome, and that is the motto of the Games.





# Legacy

## OUR VISION

Our vision is to organize the Games which will through their significance become a catalyst for sports and social change, and provide strong support to the development of university sports in Europe and Croatia as well as improve the quality of life of Croatian students in general.

Furthermore, by organizing the most successful Games to date, we will revive the vision of the EUG as an inspiration and central point of development of the EUSA. We base this vision on our own experience – the Universiade in '87 set some new standards in relation to FISU events, and even today it is mentioned as the turning point of World university sports.

Our vision does not end with the organization of the EUG 2016, but rather our long-term objective is to establish one of the most significant social-academic events in Europe.

By setting a realistic financial framework based on sustainability

and feasibility, we have the vision, strength, desire, ideas and enthusiasm to make the EUG 2016 one of the turning points in the development of the EUSA and overall European university sports.

## THE EUG 2016 INTRODUCED NEW INNOVATIONS WITHIN THE EUSA PROGRAMME

### Academic Programme

With the academic programme consisting of the Rector's conference, we want to increase the prominence of the EUSA within the academic community and through an exchange of ideas ensure quality solutions for the development of European university sports.

### Methodology Standardization

Through standardization of the Games evaluation methodology we want to provide the EUSA with a complete overview of the organization of the Games, from preparation and implementation, as well



as through dual feedback about the success of the Games, through a prism of subjective elements (participants) and objective criteria (ISO).

### Para Games

By incorporating sports for the disabled (Para Games), we will ensure activities for the important, and to date, the neglected part of the student population, thus fully integrating it into the EUSA.

### Development Fund

By introducing the Development Fund, through financial aid to NUSA users, we will ensure more integral representation of all EUSA members at the EUG and EUSA events.

### Sophisticated Volunteer Programme

Through institutional assessment of volunteer work and through the option of taking an elective class, we will introduce a monitored system of assigning ECTS credits for hours spent volunteering, as well as acquiring

competencies within the Diploma Supplement. This way we will pay back some of the warmth, smiles and energy that volunteers so selflessly invest in all of the EUSA events.

### Powered by the Games

With the organization of the "Powered by the Games" events, which promote the same values as the EUG 2016, we will improve the reputation of the Games and increase social involvement in the projects which contribute to the development of the community as a whole.

By conducting competitions in two sports which are within the program of the Paralympics Games, the EUSA would join contemporary Olympic efforts in ensuring equal conditions and providing equal chances for all individuals who want to be involved in sports.

Big sports events like EUG 2016 cannot be realized without the help of volunteers. During the European Universities Games Zagreb – Rijeka 2016, between 1,500 and 2,000 volunteers will have a unique experience by taking part in this great cultural and multi-sports event. Being aware of the importance of volunteer rights and obligations, as well as the value of volunteer contributions to the successful organization of sports events Volunteer coordinator made

an educational plan which consists of workshops and test event for the volunteers starting from October 2015; depending on the time they signed up using official internet application.

One of the key milestones of EUG 2016 was to promote volunteerism within students and young people. In August 2014, the Volunteer Department started cooperation with the Working Group at the University of Rijeka which is in charge of the EUG 2016 promotion in the academic community. The Faculty of Humanities and Social sciences decided to introduce an open elective course „Students and community” for students - volunteers on University of Rijeka, whose participations will be evaluated with 3ECTS. Focus of the course is the roll of Universities in volunteering and influence of volunteering on students. The practical part of the course will be held at EUG 2016.







# Accreditation Procedure



## ACCREDITATION

The purpose of accreditation is to define the roles, rights and responsibilities of the participants during the European Universities

Games and to provide them with the facilities necessary to successfully perform their duties/carry out their sport, as well as to ensure the general security of the participants moving

around the European Universities Games Venues. The Accreditation Card is the official document jointly issued by EUSA and the EUG 2016. The Accreditation Card will be issued once the accreditation procedures have been completed.

## ACCREDITATION CENTRES

The Main Accreditation Centre is located in Zagreb at Faculty of Kinesiology. The Accreditation Centre for Rijeka is located in place of accommodation – Student Campus. The Accreditation Centres will issue Accreditation Cards

for members of the National University Sport Federations, for press members and for the OC's VIP guests. EUSA Family members and guests will use the same Accreditation Centre in Zagreb and Rijeka. Accreditation Centres will also extend their opening hours according to the delegations' travel schedules. To assure better service, the Heads of Delegation are advised to arrive at an Accreditation Centre at least 2 or 3 days before the Opening of the European Universities Games, in order to guarantee enough time to check the data entered in the accreditation system.

## ACCREDITATION CARD

The Accreditation Card is the only official and valid document for EUG 2016 participants; therefore it must always be clearly visible in order to access restricted event areas. The Accreditation Card contains information, codes and pictograms indicating all of the holder's rights as cardholder.

All EUG 2016 participants will be divided into 7 categories: EUSA, VIP, ORGANIZING COMMITTEE, SPORT, PRESS, SECURITY and WORKFORCE (INCLUDING VOLUNTEERS).

Monitoring of access will be achieved through the Accreditation Cards, which will be checked at all site entrances. Depending on their category, each participant will be allowed to access certain zone. People not holding an Accreditation Card or holding a Card which does not have the required access rights will not be allowed to enter. Improper usage of personal Accreditation Cards is prosecutable

by law and will be reported to the Security Operational Centre and to the Head of the delegation involved.

## LOSS OF THE ACCREDITATION CARD

In case of loss of the Accreditation Card, participant must personally approach the EUG OC Accreditation Centre and report the loss by using valid Identification document (passport or ID card). Enquiries about issuing replacement cards is to be made directly at the Accreditation Centre where new cards will be printed.

In case of loss of the Accreditation Card, owner of the Card will be charged HRK 300 for re-printing of the new Card. Payment can

be made in the form of cash.

Replacement Accreditation Card will contain new personal Identification number (consists of specific letter and numbers). For your protection, once a card is replaced, the original card cannot be reactivated.

If you find the lost Accreditation Card, please promptly bring it to the EUG OC Accreditation Centre. If your Card has been unintentionally damaged or is no longer functioning, please bring the damaged card to the OC Accreditation Centre for a replacement. Note, however, that the OC Accreditation Centre reserves the right to charge a replacement fee for any Cards that appear to be intentionally damaged or defaced.

### REGULAR PROCEDURE

Accreditation procedure is completed when final approval for accreditation pass is issued by the EUG OC. Head of Delegation will be responsible for taking over all accreditations for his/her team members in particular Accreditation Centre by presenting valid Passport or ID card for each participant.

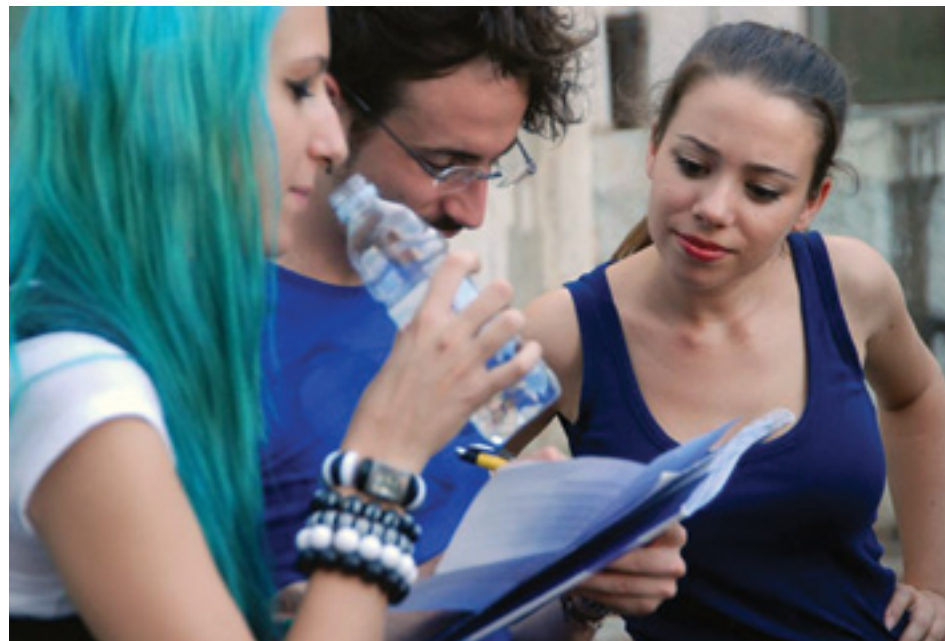
All procedures will be done in compliance with relevant EUSA Rules and Regulations:

- REG 75 Accreditation procedure starts two (2) days before each competition. Competitors cannot be accredited after the GTM.
- REG 76 Competitors are obliged to show the accreditation card to the official in charge of the match who allowed them to compete.
- REG 77 If a person, who has been refused a competitor's accreditation card, attempts to compete by means of fraud, he will be excluded from the EUG and the EUSA EC will consider if this exclusion should apply also to all future sporting events of EUSA. Should this fraud be attempted in a team competition, the team may also be excluded from the competition and any earlier results in the current competition will be cancelled. A report will be forwarded to the respective NUSA, university and a reprimand will be addressed to the team and/or competitor and the NUSA of his country.

### EXTRAORDINARY PROCEDURE

In case of objective, last minute changes, such as:

Person that applied for accreditation in the first place has been replaced by a different individual, or some other possible reasons for delay in making and distribution of accreditation, an accredited person is supposed to take over his/her accreditation in person. Applicant must personally approach the EUG OC Accreditation Centre and present valid Identification document (passport or ID card). In case of extraordinary procedure, EUG OC cannot predict the time of issuing the Accreditation Card.



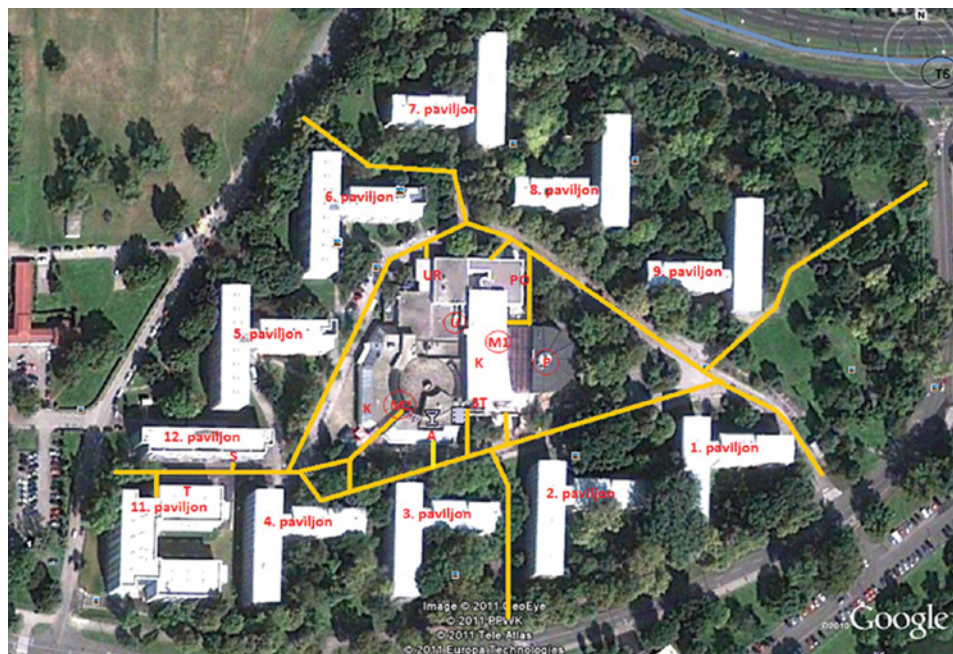


## Accommodation Zagreb



### STUDENTS' VILLAGE "STJEPAN RADIĆ"

The top contribution of entire European Universities Games Zagreb – Rijeka 2016 is the reconstruction of student accommodation facilities in



Zagreb and Rijeka. This will significantly increase student standards in Croatia. Thanks to European Universities Games, Zagreb student dormitories "Stjepan Radić" and "Cvjetno naselje" went through complete reconstruction – brand new furniture, insulation, facades, environment, sports facilities, rooms with refrigerators, etc.

Accommodations for participants will be in the Students' village "Stjepan Radić", at the address of Jarunska cesta 2 in Zagreb, Croatia. The village encompasses 12 pavilions and one central building, which houses the restaurants and a number of other services.

The accreditation centre is across the street in Faculty of Kinesiology building. Once you've received your accreditation, you'll be able to enter the village itself. From there, you'll need to proceed to the appropriate reception to check-in and receive the key to your room. There is one reception, in the 12th pavilion (marked in the map with a red 12, near the entrance), where you can check in for the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 7th, 8th, 9th 11th and 12th pavilions. Pavilions 11 and 12 are reserved for officials and representatives of national federations.











Due to space limitations, officials may be quartered in the pavilions with the athletes (Pavilions 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9). During the accreditation process, you'll receive a list of rooms which have been reserved for your group – a list which includes the names and placement of athletes and officials.

Each team will be roomed as a group, alongside teams from their home nation in the same sport. This may mean that some of you may be quartered with athletes from different Universities from your own country – in double rooms.

As bathrooms are not attached to individual rooms, but to floors, floors will be reserved either for men or women.

Please keep in mind that the common areas of the pavilions are monitored via CCTV cameras. Please refrain from doing anything against the rules and general ethics.

On your day of departure, you're required to check-out by 12.00 hours (noon). We understand that your actual departure time might be different, so you can store your luggage at the reception for later pickup.

The receptions will work the entire day, 0-24. Aside from checking in and out, you can also leave your keys there while you're away from the dormitories. In fact, we strongly recommend that you do so. It's safer and there's less chance of them

becoming lost.

In fact, while we're at it – and we'll get to this in detail later – losing your key is going to be particularly expensive. They're hard to replace, so we advise you not to lose it.

### Damages and House Rules

Contrary to prior information, due to legal and practical reasons, there is no deposit for accommodation on EUG 2016. That doesn't mean you won't be charged for damages in case they occur. Keep in mind, we do have cameras for the common areas – and rooming lists, so there is a way to determine who's responsible.

An inventory list will be available, in addition to the House Rules, of the Athletes' village, in each room. This list will include an itemized list of furniture inside the room ... and how much they cost. You'll be held liable for any damages caused in the room – we'll check the rooms after you return the key during check-out.

In addition, the inventory list contains the price for the keys of the room. This, more than anything, are the easiest items to lose – we'd advise you take care of those. While they might not be the most expensive things in the room, they do cost a fair penny.

The inventory list looks a bit like this:

The prices will be listed in Croatian Kuna, as it's the legal tender in the Republic of Croatia (and we're obligated to do so), but also in Euros – which is the currency which will count towards damages.

As already mentioned, House Rules will be available in each room. They're relatively short, fortunately. Unfortunately, there are a few important ones. No larger parties, no alcohol or smoking in the village (there will be organized parties outside the village for your convenience). Security personnel will be patrolling to make sure – particularly after midnight. So try to keep it reasonable – we're not saying not to have fun, but do be responsible (and, remember – cameras).

### Rooms

There are two categories of rooms. The 11th pavilion is a bit different from the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 7th, 8th and 9th pavilions. Depending on where you're quartered, the rooms

will be different and we'll be going into detail about those here.

Starting with the pavilions where the majority of participants will be staying, the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 7th, 8th and 9th pavilions are the most recently renovated. In spite of this, there are some things that weren't added. Air conditioning, for example, is not available. There are electric outlets, but we advise you against trying to bring a mobile air-conditioning unit into a room even if you have one – the electrical grid might not be able to cope with the demands. It was designed with only a few small items in mind – computers, hair dryers, refrigerators. That sort of thing.

Bed linens will be provided and ready when you check into your rooms. In accordance with the rules, they'll be replaced every 4 days, but if you really need them replaced (like, say, spilling tea over them – perfectly innocent) you can request new ones at the desk on the ground floor in each pavilion.



Bathrooms are joint ones, with each floor having one complete with toilets and showers. Soap is available there, towels and shower gels will be available in each room. In the event you run out, there is a grocery store in the central section of the village (remember that map on the start of this document, it's a bit below the area marked with a red M1) – you can buy replacement ones there – or ones more in line with your personal tastes.

This finally brings us to the 11th pavilion. These pavilions are reserved for national federations and officials (we don't actually have the space to quarter all officials in them, so some of you may wind up in rooms with athletes). While substantially larger, the rooms and arrangements are functionally identical to those of the primary pavilions – feel free to look through those lists to see the details.

That said, there is one major difference. Bathrooms aren't by floor – bathrooms are shared by two rooms, but are otherwise private.

### Team meeting rooms

Each pavilion actually has a room that will be available for team meetings. There won't be schedules, locks or anything – feel free to use it, just remember that other teams might need to use the rooms, too.

### Catering

Foods are provided in two restaurants (marked on that map way back at the start with red M1 and M2).

The fenced-off area is where you

wait in line between the entrance and the food area. Plates and cutlery are left in the kitchen when you're done – a counter plainly visible from the eating area, right next to the food line. The exit is directly from the area where you'll be eating, so as not to hold up the line.

Food selection is diverse. The basic menus are: meat (in case there's pork, there will be non-pork variants available), fish and vegetarian. Gluten-free food is available and there will be daily menus available in the restaurants which will list the foods available that day. Vegan food is not

specifically prepared, but you can ask the kind ladies and gentlemen behind to combine specific types of dishes and side-dishes to suit your tastes.

While you're limited to three meals per day, there will be a special area available with salads, pastas and such – in case you get peckish. There's also a third restaurant, but a bit more on that later.

The restaurants will be operating three meals: breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Working hours are as follows:



- **Breakfast: 06.00 – 10.00**
- **Lunch: 11.30 – 17.00**
- **Dinner: 18.00 – 23.00**

You can also request lunch packages in case you'll not be present for lunch – this can be done at the Info Point (there will be a person available for orders) – but remember that this won't be as good as the stuff in the restaurants and that there's a time-limit on orders. Orders will only be received by 17.00 (five o'clock) on the previous day. You can't order for the same day.

There's also a third restaurant (red letter P on that map) – this one isn't free. Including pizzas, ice-creams, cakes and a selection of regular food, this restaurant is available for use, but their services will have to be paid for. This restaurant doubles as a coffee shop and an ice-cream parlour – since you don't necessarily have to eat actual food in there.

### ADDITIONAL SERVICES WITHIN ATHLETES VILLAGE IN ZAGREB

So, apart from sleeping and eating, what else is there to do in the Athletes' village (famous as 'Sava')? Well, here's a brief rundown of the activities (and services, actually, it's mostly services – but some of them are quite vital services), available in the village for the duration of EUG 2016.

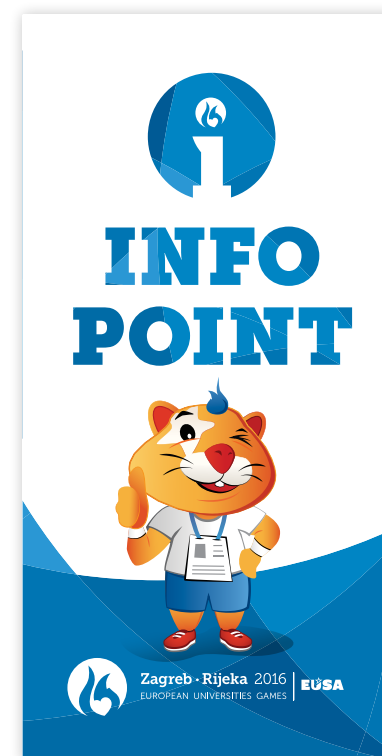
### Info Point

The basic idea behind the Info Point is that, if you have any questions or uncertainties, you come there and get

the appropriate information. It's really not a very complicated concept. Anyway, there will be one central Info Point in the Athletes' Village.

It's in the central island (the big building in the middle of the village), right next to the entrance into Restaurant 1. It's also going to be market as such.

Info point will receive orders for lunch packages. So, if you make a request on the day you require a lunch package ... we can't get that done, it's going to be ignored. Due to





health, safety and hygienic concerns (as well as the fact that it will be rather warm, which means that longer exposure could turn the food into something of a health hazard) – and the fact that our cooks need to ensure food for several thousand people is ready on time, we won't be taking orders after 17.00 hours.

Another service, except these two on Info point is reservation of your travel to Rijeka. You'll need to submit request 48 hours before. Hope that you understand reasons for this demands.

All protests (we know you will not have many) can be made only in Resolution office, which is located in Faculty of Kinesiology, on right entrance.

### Laundry service

Located on the ground floor of Pavilion 12 (to your left as you enter the village, just before the Reception area), it's the third door on the left side, occupying the space between the copy shop (which won't be working during the Games), Tourist agency (which will be working) and Hair salon (which will be working).

The laundry will be working 0-24 for your convenience. You can deliver clothes for washing at any time. The service is, however, charged - 50 Croatian kuna per wash (detergent and drying included). That's per wash, by the way, not per, say, shirt of pair of pants. So the price drops considerably if you get together with your team-mates to use the laundry.

The process is fairly simple. You

come in, deliver the clothes you want washed as a group, take a receipt, then you pick it up with that same receipt after an appropriate time (typically, this does take some time, so you'll need to stop by when the staff from the Laundry tell you so).

### Gym

The gym is located in Pavilion 11, on the north side of the building – you can access it through the main entrance into the Pavilion. The gym is free for use by all participants, both athletes and officials. It will work between 06:00 and 24:00.

### Massage room

Located right next to the gym, the otherwise empty room can be used as a massage room by teams with their own physiotherapist and massage bed (we will provide 3 extra beds). Usage of the room is on a principle of first-come, first-served, we won't be controlling who uses it and when.

### Sports field

But that's a futsal field, you might say, upon seeing the picture. Yes, that would indeed be a futsal field and



not a more general sports field. Well, at least, that is what it is currently. It's actually adjustable and it can be a basketball field and volleyball field. Depending on the teams present in a specific period, it could very well be adjusted. There's no rules to using the field. No schedules, no lists, just free access. Have a go at it at will. Organize an impromptu international championship, if you want to.

### Team meeting rooms

There are meeting rooms in each pavilion and they'll be marked (they're repurposed classrooms). The rooms won't be locked and we won't control who's using them or when. So, in short, the meeting rooms are available on a basis of first-come, first-serve. Though do remember that there are other teams, so try to be reasonable about using the meeting rooms.

### Additional restaurant, grocery store and news-stand

These facilities are operated by the Students' Centre and that means that all services provided by those facilities are charged accordingly.

The grocery store sells the usual assortment of goods. Feel free to browse. In case you need something extra (or you forgot to take something with you) or in case you run out of something you'd brought, you can get it here. The store typically works from 07:00 – 21:00, with shorter working hours on Sundays. We'll try to get that somewhat extended during the Games, but we've made a policy of

not making promises we can't keep – so, you get the latest information.

The third restaurant is one where you can buy meals – largely grilled stuff, pizzas and the usual. Unlike the primary restaurants, you can use this one without limitation. It's located centrally in the village and it doesn't work during breakfast hours, but it does work during lunch and dinner time (you can use the restaurant working hours for orientation).

### Medical room

The Athletes' village comes with a fully equipped infirmary. We've taken possession of that area for your convenience. The health centre will be operational all hours of the day (0-24), in case of emergency.

## STUDENTS VILLAGE – STUDENTS DORMITORY TRSAT

### Accommodation – General Information

All accredited participants will be accommodated in the Campus



area Trsat and Ivan Goran Kovačić dormitory, co-located with the EUG offices, laundry service station, a restaurant and a fitness gym located in Ivan Goran Kovačić. Check in will be at 12 p.m. (noon). The campus will only be used for the accommodation and service of the participants of the Games – entry will be restricted to accredited persons only. With regards to damages, a clear list of items and costs for replacement will be visible in each room. The persons accommodated in said room will be held responsible for the items listed, including the payment of the damages.

### Laundry service

Laundry will be collected at the Info point located in the Pavilion 4. The laundry service is chargeable, will issue a receipt for the laundry and within 24h the laundry could be collected with the same receipt in the same spot.

### Para-athletes

The students with disabilities will be accommodated in rooms meeting the required standard. If requested, the personal assistants of students with disabilities shall have a possibility to stay in the same room; otherwise they will be accommodated in the nearby rooms. Special transportation arrangements have been made for para-athletes and transports will pick them up within the village grounds, stopping in front of the pavilion where they will have accommodations.

### Massage Room

Teams with their own physiotherapist and their personal massage bed can use this room. It functions as first come first served.

### Additional Rooms

Meeting room can freely be used for team meetings at all times. There will be no control or scheduling system for the rooms. Computer room with computers will be on disposal. The campus will have a TV room open for participants.

### Catering

Breakfast will be served buffet style. Participants will choose from suggested menus for lunch and dinner. The meals will be prepared and served by the canteen staff who will wear distinctive uniforms determined by the facility. The quality and quantity of food is within the EUSA minimum requirements. The restaurants will be working between 06.00 and 23.00 hours, with pauses between meals due to the staff's need to prepare for the next meal. As a result, food will be served as follows:

- **Breakfast: 06.00 – 10.00**
- **Lunch: 11.30 – 16.00**
- **Dinner: 18.00 – 23.00**

An additional room will be used for EUSA representatives, VIP guests and referees. They will have a buffet-style served food in this room. The room is air-conditioned. Lunch packages will be available if requested. Orders will be received by noon on the previous day.





### **Check-in procedure, check-out procedure**

Accommodations for participants will be in the Students' village "Kampus Trsat" at the address of Radmile Matejčić 5 in Rijeka, Croatia. The village encompasses 3 pavilions and one central building, which houses the restaurant and a number of other services. Once you've received your accreditation. From there, you'll need to proceed to the appropriate reception to check-in and receive the key to your room. There is one reception in the 4th pavilion. Due to space requirements, officials will be quartered in the pavilions with the athletes. After the accreditation process, you'll receive a list of rooms which have been reserved for your group – a list which includes placement of athletes and officials. Each team will be roomed as a group, alongside teams from their home nation. This may mean that some of you may be quartered with athletes from different Universities from your own country or you may be quartered on your own. That's two persons per room. Bathrooms are attached to individual rooms. Please keep in mind that the common areas of the pavilions are monitored via CCTV cameras. Try not to do anything inappropriate. On your day of departure, you're required to check-out by 11.00 A.M. The receptions will work the entire day, 0-24. You can also leave your keys there while you're away from the dormitories,

which is highly recommended. It's safer and there's less chance of them becoming lost.

### **Damages and House Rules**

You'll be held liable for any damages caused in the room – we'll check the rooms after you return the key during check-out. In addition, the inventory list contains the price for the keys of the room and other inventory available in room. In case of any damages, participants will be treated accordingly to Croatian and EU legislation. As already mentioned, House Rules will be available in each room. There are a few important ones. No larger parties, no alcohol or smoking in the village. Security personnel will be patrolling to make sure you're safe.

### **Rooms**

Rooms are single and double. Bed linens will be provided and ready when you check into your rooms. In accordance with the rules, they'll be replaced every 4 days, but if you really need them replaced, you can request new ones at the reception. Soap is available, towels and shower gels will be available in each room.

### **Restaurant**

Food selection is diverse. The basic menus are: meat, fish and vegetarian. Vegan food is not specifically prepared, but you can ask the kind ladies and gentlemen behind to combine specific types of dishes and side-dishes to suit your tastes. Menus will be in English. Upon your

arrival, you will receive coupons for each day of your stay. Entrance to restaurant area will be possible only to accredited participants. Within restaurant there is also a pizzeria which you can use at your own cost. You're limited to three meals per day. The restaurant will be operating three meals: breakfast, lunch and dinner. You can also request lunch packages in case you'll not be present for lunch but there's a time-limit on orders. Orders will only be received by 12.00 (noon) on the previous day. You can't order for the same day. Protocol to be provided upon your arrival.





## STUDENT DORMITORY "IVAN GORAN KOVAČIĆ"

### Accommodation – General Information

All accredited participants will be accommodated in two places, the Campus area Trsat and Ivan Goran Kovačić dormitory, co-located with the EUG offices, laundry service station, a restaurant on Trsat and a fitness gym located in Ivan Goran Kovačić. Check in will be in 12 p.m. The Campus will only be used for the accommodation and service of the participants of the Games – entry will be restricted to accredited persons only.

With regards to damages, a clear list of items and costs for replacement will be visible in each room. The persons accommodated in said room will be held responsible for the items listed, including the payment of the damages.

### Laundry service

Laundry will be collected at the Info point located in the Pavilion 1. The laundry service will issue a receipt for the laundry and within 24h the laundry could be collected with the same receipt in the same spot. The exchange of towel and bed linen will be every four days, whilst cleaning will be on daily basis.

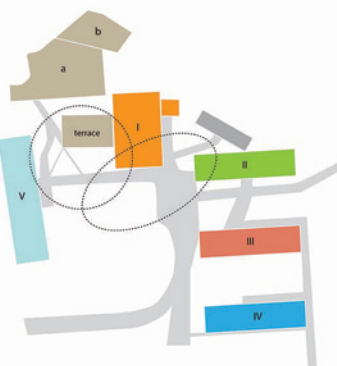

There is one reception in the 1st pavilion. Due to space requirements, officials will be quartered in the pavilions with the athletes. #### **House rules in Student's villages Zagreb and Rijeka**

- 1** After taking the key of the room at the reception, and following entrance into the room, you are obligated to read the inventory of the room and report all potential issues at the reception desk.
- 2** On the day of departure, the room must be vacated by 12.00 hours (noon) of that day. Personal luggage may be kept at reception until departure, provided there is space (space is allocated on a first-come-first-serve basis).
- 3** When leaving (checking out) of the room, you are obligated to invite a person from the organizer (EUG or SC) which will, following an inspection of the room, issue a confirmation of turn-over, which includes any issues that might have arisen. The key is returned to reception.
- 4** While accommodated within the Students' village, you are obligated to respect the following house rules:
  - loud noise or loud playing of music is not allowed at any time of day;
  - organization of larger parties in rooms and common areas is forbidden;
  - cooking of food in the tea kitchenettes is not allowed;
  - smoking is not allowed;
  - consumption of alcohol is not allowed.
- 5** All eventual damages committed by the end-user of accommodation services must be paid by the end-user when leaving (checking out) of the room in accordance with the applicable pricing list.

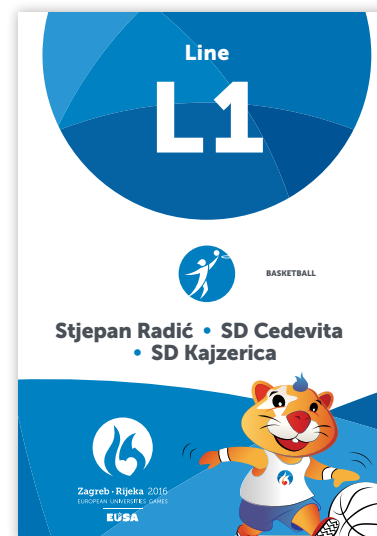

## General medical services

**24 hour medical assistance will be provided in the Athletes Villages.**



### GENERAL MEDICAL CARE

Medical care and public health support during the EUG 2016 includes the provision of:

- Out of competition emergency services;
- Medical services at venues;
- Polyclinic and hospital services;
- Sanitary and epidemiological surveillance of environmental conditions, accommodation and catering.

Medical services will be provided free of charge for all accredited participants.

### OUT OF COMPETITION EMERGENCY SERVICES

Minor medical emergencies will be taken care of by local medical centres (phone numbers in Zagreb and Rijeka will be provided in information material upon arrival). Serious emergencies will be handled by the national emergency service (phone number 112).

### MEDICAL SERVICES AT VENUES

At all training and competition venues, medical staff (medical doctors and nurses supported by ambulances) will be available to provide medical care complying with EUSA regulations. Services will be available during competition and official training as well as during opening and closing ceremonies.

### POLYCLINIC AND HOSPITAL SERVICES

Medical problems requiring more specialized care will be handled by polyclinics and hospitals in Zagreb and Rijeka. Hospitals in Zagreb and Rijeka cover all major medical specializations and are equipped with up-to date medical facilities capable of dealing with most serious medical emergencies.

### SANITARY AND EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SURVEYANCE OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS, ACCOMMODATION AND CATERING

Regular microbiological inspections of accommodation and catering facilities will be carried out during the Games. An epidemiologist will be closely collaborating with the International Medical Commission. Beds in a hospital's isolation ward will be allocated in the case of an epidemiological emergency.



### TEAM DOCTORS AND MEDICAL ROOMS

Registered team doctors will be allowed to deliver medical care to their athletes (or other teams) by special arrangements.

### VACCINATION

All participants are advised to undergo vaccinations against infectious diseases in accordance with national vaccination protocols approved in the country of





residence. Influenza immunization is also recommended and should be obtained no later than two weeks before arrival in Zagreb or Rijeka.

#### **MEDICATION AND MEDICAL EQUIPMENT**

EU Import regulations and Croatia customs regulations allow foreign visitors to bring required medication for their own use or consumption while in Croatia, with some restrictions. Psychotropic substances and narcotics (i.e., opium, morphine and marihuana) are forbidden. Import of prohibited substances included in the WADA list is likewise forbidden ([www.wada-ama.org](http://www.wada-ama.org)). A team doctor or trainer should supervise and check any pharmaceutical products, dietary supplements or medical equipment brought into Croatia. Pharmaceutical products and preparations, dietary

supplements, medical devices and equipment shall be used personally and directly for the EUG 2016. The remaining part shall be reported immediately after the Games.

Delegations will be responsible for the stock of medications brought into Croatia for the duration of their stay. This medication will not be stored or monitored in any way by the OC. Should athletes or other members of the EUSA Family bring their own medication, they are recommended to carry the relevant prescriptions. Medicine must be labelled with the contained substance as well as the name of the individual using it, including dosage. Only the amount of medication necessary during the visit to Croatia should be imported. The quantity brought into the country should be equal to or less than a month's supply.



## Insurance

Participating teams are responsible for insurance of their delegation against all claims for loss and injury to competitors.





# Safety and Security Rules

## ARRANGEMENTS AND PRINCIPLES

The international character of the European Universities Games and the presence of eminent personalities during the event, require the assurance of the highest level of prevention, security, public peacekeeping and surveillance. This will be carried out by taking into consideration the current international and national situation, as well as any problems which may occur immediately before or during the event.

Furthermore, in the interest of public safety and to safeguard a peaceful environment, immediate action will be taken in the case of strikes, unannounced forms of protest, demonstrations or any criminal or irresponsible actions. The main aims of the security arrangements are to protect the safety of delegations, ensure public safety and the orderly inflow and outflow of athletes, journalists and public, and to continuously monitor streets adjacent to the sport venues

in order to prevent any crowd congestion or critical situations.

Given the geographical distribution of the competition venues and the hotels, a distributed approach to security has also been taken. This has been achieved through careful planning, defining security procedures to be followed in each site, and implementing tight coordination and effective communication between all the security officials, inspectors and volunteers.

Monitoring of access will be achieved through the Accreditation Cards, which will be checked at all site entrances. People not holding an Accreditation Card or holding a Card which does not have the required access rights will not be allowed to enter. Improper usage of personal Accreditation Cards is prosecutable by law and will be reported to the Security Operational Centre and to the Head of the delegation involved.

Public peacekeeping and security services will be implemented by ensuring appropriate levels of law

enforcement. Police officers will be located in the Police Stations in each venue cluster. An Operations Centre located in Faculty of Kinesiology will be set up for the Games. The Centre will have real-time status reporting from all the competition venues. A detailed description of the security procedure and measures will be available at each venue and hotel.

## SECURITY AT THE SPORT VENUES

At the sports venues, the main security objective is to assure the athletes' privacy and to guarantee the smooth running of the European Universities Games. This will be achieved by strict control of the Accreditation Cards at the main entrances and by rigorously separating the different areas inside stadiums and games areas.

Moreover, athletes' safety will be taken into consideration by reserving specific drop-off/pick-up areas where buses can stop and safely discharge their passengers. Traffic in

and around the competition venues will be regulated by local Police Officers, while EUG Volunteers will be in charge of directing cars and buses to the appropriate parking areas, according to their Pass codes. Security corridors will be set up to facilitate access for emergency vehicles.

## SECURITY AT THE ACCREDITATION CENTRES

Particular care will be given to security during all period of the EUG 2016, when delegations will be arriving with their personal luggage and belongings. Professional security guards will provide the nightly surveillance of the buildings.

## SECURITY AT THE ATHLETES VILLAGE

Athletes in the Athlete Village will have to comply with Athlete Village rules and fire safety requirements. Athlete village has a specific evacuation plan.







### SECURITY AT THE OPENING AND CLOSING CEREMONIES

Since the Opening Ceremony will be held outdoors ("Mladost" Athletic Stadium), the Croatia Police Force will ensure public safety and manage traffic flow. EUG Volunteers will control access to the tribunes and help manage the delegation parade. A reinforced security staff will be assigned to the Closing Ceremony, which will take place also outdoors, in Rijeka - "Korzo".

### EMERGENCY

Special phone numbers listed in this brochure are to be called in case of emergencies in order to immediately contact the Police, Fire Brigade or Ambulance services. Detailed instructions and information will be provided upon arrival. Evacuation and security plans are in place for all EUG Venues.

### Spotting and observation of suspicious situations and events!

- Timely detection and observation of accidental events and situations can prevent their escalation, and on such situations it is necessary to inform the nearest members of the Security Service (security guards or police officers)
- These accident situations can arise both among viewers and between individual competitors, individual team members or other team official participants.
- It can be verbal conflicts that

can quickly turn into a physical confrontation, or otherwise expressing intolerance at the national, religious, racial or political grounds.

- Timely detection and observation of suspect and deferred items (packages, wrappers, various boxes or any other items that may give doubt that can pose a threat) can also have a positive preventive effect, and on such situations is also necessary to inform the nearest members of the Security Service (security guards or a police officer)

### Finding lost items and things!

- In case of finding lost objects and things, or if one of the other citizens present, official participants find and deliver Found a lost object or thing, the same should be immediately handed over to the nearest member of the Security Service (security guards or police officers).
- We ask all participants of the Games to pay attention to the behaviour of individuals and / or groups that are unusual for sporting events, which may suggest the preparation and commission of serious criminal offenses, including terrorist acts. This, however, may be people who are in the facilities of accommodation and competition behaving strangely and show excessive signs: anxiety, restlessness, sweating, fidgeting, distraction,

rigid posture and the like.

- If you notice describes the behaviour, please inform your members and volunteers of the Security Committee or the nearest security guard.
- The participants of the Games, please pay attention to any suspicious items that may serve the commission of the offense or otherwise harm the safety of participants in the competition and the Games in general, and inform the members and volunteers of the Security Committee or the nearest security guard
- In line with the positive Croatian

legislation, and to prevent possible accidents, it is recommended not bringing alcoholic beverages in the facilities of accommodation, competition and training ESI 2016.

- **112 - Single European emergency number 112**, you can call at any time of day or night, regardless of where you are in Croatia. The phone call is free, and you can make across all mobile and fixed networks and with all telephones.

## OPENING CEREMONY

The EUG 2016 Opening Ceremony will take place on Wednesday, July 13, 2016 and will commence at 21.00 with a live TV broadcast by the national TV broadcaster (HRT), with an expected duration of 120 minutes.

All teams participating at EUG 2016 are invited to take part in the march. In order to participate in the march all teams should enter the stadium at its north gate between 18.00 to 18.30 and proceed to the assembly area at the west side of the stadium. There EUG 2016 staff members and volunteers will provide marching pass participants with the necessary information. The participants will subsequently form a marching column. The marching column will consist of column leaders (EUG 2016 volunteers), than flag bearers (who are EUG 2016 staff members) followed by team members. One team member per university is expected to carry their university signs.

Due to the live TV broadcast, limited timing and protocol reasons all march participants are kindly requested to follow their column leaders and walk in a manner which would enable the maintenance of the planned distance between teams. By following this procedure all participating teams would be equally and in a dignified way presented to the spectators at the Stadium and TV audience. In this formation all teams will enter the Stadium and by walking along the athletic track will eventually enter the central field of play. During this walk you are welcome to mimic our dancers or create your own moves. At the central field of play our volunteers will guide the teams to their positions. Upon arrival to their positions team members are expected to keep their position during the ceremony. However, you are free to choose – keep on standing or sit down on the grass. You are

welcome to take active part in the Ceremony program by following simple choreography instructions you will be given by our staff members. All march past participants are invited to dress up per team in accordance with their possibilities and imagination (University/NUSA uniforms).

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# TAEKWONDO

## TAE 1 INTERNATIONAL REGULATIONS

The organization of the EUG Taekwondo shall be mainly based on the latest Technical Regulations of the European Taekwondo Union (ETU).

## TAE 2 COMPETITIONS

## TAE 3 PROGRAM

The competitions consist of three (3) days. The General Technical Meeting, where the presence of each head of the delegation is obligatory, will be held one (1) day prior to the start of the competition.

## TAE 4 DELEGATION

The delegation will consist of athletes and officials from their respective university. The head of the delegation must be appointed. Athlete shall have minimum red belt.

In addition, the delegation may, at its own cost, include a referee with at least the highest national license; the relevant license of the national taekwondo federation must be submitted two (2) months prior to the competition. Accommodation and food for the referee must be provided by the Organizing Committee without charging the participation fee; no refereeing fee is provided.

## TAE 5 PLAYING SCHEME

The format of the tournament will be decided by Competition Commission taking into consideration the number of athletes entered.

## TAE 6 DRAW, SEEDING

The draw will be done in the presence of a EUSA Representative taking into account EUSA taekwondo and ETU ranking.

## TAE 7 FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

Each team has to pay fees defined in EUG Regulations by the specified date. The deposit must be paid on EUSA request.
