**5. QUALIFICATIONS**

In accordance with *Article 4: Qualification of Contestant* of the WT Competition Rules, the contestant must be:

<b>CRITERION #1:</b>	Holder of an active approved WT Global Athlete Licence(GAL) <i>* Any questions on the WT GAL please contact your assigned WT GMS Manager</i>
<b>CRITERION #2:</b>	Holder of the Kukkiwon Dan or Poom Certificate (* A copy of the Dan certificate should be uploaded to GMS when registering for the event. In case a contestant has applied for a Kukkiwon Dan certificate but has not received it yet, a copy of the Dan application form and the remittance certificate sent to the Kukkiwon must be uploaded to GMS when registering for the event. Please refer to the Kukkiwon Web site ( <a href="http://www.kukkiwon.or.kr">www.kukkiwon.or.kr</a> ) for more information.)
<b>CRITERION #3:</b>	<b>An athlete must be 17 years old or older.</b> An athlete who was born in the year of 2008 or before is eligible to participate in the competition.

## 6. COMPETITION RULES

WT Competition Rules as of September 30, 2024 shall be applied.

## 7. METHOD OF COMPETITION

- i. Best of 3 System shall be applied
- ii. Single elimination system with bronze medal contest
- iii. Event Grade: G-2
- iv. Number of athletes: Maximum 400 athletes for 8 weight categories  
(Maximum 50 athletes per weight category without exceeding maximum quota per nation - 4 )
- v. Maximum quotas per Nationality: Maximum four(4) athletes per weight category

## 8. ATHLETE SELECTION CRITERIA

- i. Athletes who meet the eligibility criteria may register and participate through their Member National Associations (MNAs)
- ii. Each MNA may register up to four(4) athletes per weight category
- iii. Maximum 50 athletes per weight category will be included in the athletes list. The selection is made based on the order of registration on GMS(first-come, first-served basis)
  - A. In case registration made by a MNA exceeds 4 athletes in each weight category, very first 4 athletes in the order of registration will be selected
  - B. In case more than 4 athletes are registered by a MNA simultaneously, 4 athletes with the higher ranking on the registration date will be selected
- iv. Athletes who registered but not selected will be placed on a waitlist. If a selected athlete withdraws, WT may allocate the spot to the next athlete on the waitlist in order of registration made on GMS.

## 9. ATHLETE QUOTA

- i. Maximum four(4) athletes per weight category for each MNA
- ii. Host Country Quota: There is no Host Country Quota.  
The host country is allocated with maximum quota of four(4) athletes per weight category

## 10. SEEDING AND DRAWING OF LOTS

- i. All ranked athletes based on 2025 June WT Olympic ranking shall be seeded accordingly.
- ii. In case of athletes without WT Olympic ranking as of 2025 June shall be seeded randomly among those without WT Olympic ranking.
- iii. Host Country Seeding: There is no host country seeding for GP Challenge
- iv. Draw of Lots will be conducted one(1) day before the competition following the general weigh in.
- v. Draw will be uploaded on WT website – GP Challenge notice page

## 11. INVITATION TO 2026 WORLD TAEKWONDO GRAND PRIX SERIES 1

- i. Athletes who are placed 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> (Gold Medalist, Silver Medalist, and Bronze Medalist) will receive an invitation to the 2026 WT Grand Prix Series 1.
- ii. The maximum invitation quota to the 2026 WT Grand Prix Series 1 is limited to one(1) athlete per MNA in each weight category.

## 12. REGISTRATION TIMELINE

- i. Registration will open 13 weeks before the competition starts (March 14<sup>th</sup>) and close 7 weeks before the start of the competition (April 25<sup>th</sup>) to ensure time for visa applications.
- ii. Once the MNA makes registration on GMS, no changes shall be made – changes includes but not limited to the athletes' name, weight categories, or other details related to participating athletes – after the registration deadline except for Late Athlete Replacements(LAR).
- iii. The list of selected athletes will be published or communicated within 1 week from the registration deadline.
- iv. Athletes registered but not selected will be removed from GMS registration for the event.

### 13. WITHDRAWAL PENALTIES

- v. Penalty
  - Any confirmed athlete who withdraws within two(2) weeks before 00:00 Swiss local time on the date of Head of Team Meeting, for any reason(including medical purposes), will not be allowed to participate in the next GP Challenge.
  - All selected athletes should apply and obtain entry visa for USA in advance. No athlete will be excused for cancelling the registration due to visa except athletes additionally selected as a replacement after May 25<sup>th</sup> the abovementioned penalty will be given to the athlete.

### 14. LATE ATHLETE REPLACEMENT (LAR)

- i. Late Athlete Replacement due to injury will be handled case by case – MNA must inform WT Sport & Event Management Department for any decision related to the LAR. LAR is only applicable for athletes within same weight category.
- ii. LAR requests will be accepted up to 48 hours before the Head of Team Meeting (Local time). After the mentioned period, there is no LAR case accepted under any circumstances.

### 16. CONDITIONS FOR PARTICIPATING TEAMS

Round trip airfare and accommodation charges of room and board shall be borne by the participating athlete or Member National Association.

### 17. WT GLOBAL LICENCE & ONLINE REGISTRATION

- i. WT Global License Registration  
All athletes and team officials must FIRST be registered with active WT Global Athlete License (GAL) or Global Official License (GOL).
- ii. Entry will only be accepted through the WT online registration system and registration is only possible with a valid WT Global Licence. Team GMS admins will be notified via email once online registration is open. All athletes and officials must be registered under team name "Country Name", for example **"Uzbekistan National Team" or "Uzbekistan team"**

### 18. ENTRY FEES

The OC shall collect the entry fees from the participating teams. Each team shall pay entry fee to the Organizing Committee by online payment on GMS. In case of any teams incapable of making online payment, the bank transfer will be available. Athletes shall not be allowed to compete without successful payment of entry fee to the Organizing Committee. Those athletes that cancel due to medical reasons and authorized by WT Medical Chair, shall not be charged entry fee.

**REGULAR ENTRY FEES:** The teams must **complete registration and entry fee payment** during this period.

- US \$100 per athlete.
- Regular entry fee period will begin on March 14<sup>th</sup>, 17:00 Local Swiss Time.
- Regular entry fee period will end on April 25<sup>th</sup>, 17:00 Local Swiss Time.

**Following close of Registration Period:**

Following the end of the registration on **April 25<sup>th</sup>**, the WT Sport & Event Management Department will review the online registration list and athletes list ***will be posted on the WT website GP Challenge notice section*** from **April 28<sup>th</sup>**

## 19. ENTRY DEADLINES & IMPORTANT DATES

- Entry deadline for registration period is **April 25<sup>th</sup>, 17:00 Local Swiss Time**. Entry submission after this date will be not accepted under any circumstances.
  - Following the end of the registration on **April 25<sup>th</sup>**, the WT Sport & Event Management Department will review the online registration list and the athletes list in each category will be posted on-the WT website GP Challenge notice section from **April 28<sup>th</sup>**. ***Athletes who are not selected within athletes list will be automatically excluded from the GMS registration.***
  - The registered athletes or team officials may be replaced **without any penalty** until **April 25<sup>th</sup>**. Entry fee of US\$100 per athlete will be charged in case of cancellation of participation after **April 25<sup>th</sup>**.
    - **Athletes:** MNAs must submit entry online by logging into the WT GMS for athlete(s). A MNA can send a maximum 4 athletes per weight category. No entry will be accepted or modified at the accreditation center(s) in Charlotte.
    - **Team officials:** MNAs have to register online by logging in to the WT GMS (Refer to 15. Team Entries per country)
    - **Penalty:** Penalty of US\$100 per person shall be paid to the Organizing Committee at the accreditation center in Charlotte in the following cases.
      1. Any team official who is not registered online wants to be accredited at the accreditation center in Charlotte although the total number of team officials does not exceed the designated number.
      2. In case of exceeding designated number of MNA officials wants to be accredited at the accreditation center in Charlotte or any MNA official who is not registered online wants to be accredited at the accreditation center in Charlotte.
      3. Any changes or additions to team official after April 25<sup>th</sup>. This penalty will be considered the onsite fee for approved additions or changes to the national team list.
- **Any WT Global License registration completed onsite will be charged a US\$50 onsite processing fee for each WT Global License required.**

## 20. CLASSIFICATION OF RESULTS

Medals will be awarded to the top athletes in the respective weight category of the pertinent competition:

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\* \* Maximum invitation quota to 2026 WT Grand Prix Series 1 is one(1) per nation. In case 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> placed



athletes are from same nation, the invitation to 2026 WT Grand Prix Series 1 is granted to the next highest placed athlete.

For allocation of invitation to 2026 WT Grand Prix Series 1, athletes ranking within Charlotte 2025 World Taekwondo Grand Prix Challenge shall be allocated as follows.

All athletes will get ranking point. The points will be reflected on WT World Ranking and WT Olympic Ranking. The ranking points per winners of the competition shall be allocated as follows.

## 22. WT-RECOGNIZED TAEKWONDO UNIFORM AND PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- i. **DAEDO EPRO 2990 GEN 3 v2 Protector and Scoring System (PSS) including PSS Headgear** will be used for the competition.
- ii. Participating contestants are required to wear WT-recognized Kyorugi competition uniform and WT-recognized protective equipment. The latest version of WT-recognized manufacturers' list is available at the website of WT (<http://www.worldtaekwondo.org/wtf-partners/recognized>).
- iii. The Organizing Committee will provide Protector and Scoring System (PSS) to the participating contestants. Participating contestants are required to bring their own groin guards, mouthguard, gloves, sensing socks and shin and forearm guards for their personal use.
- iv. Before entering the field of play, all contestants will proceed to the inspection desk for inspection of competition uniform and protective equipment. **Any contestant who wears unofficial competition uniform or protective equipment will not be permitted to enter Field of Play and compete.**
- v. The top has to cover completely the buttocks. However, the bottom of top should be more than 15cm above the knee cap.
- vi. Instant Video Replay (IVR) System will be used.

## 23. IDENTIFICATION OF NOC CODE AND MANUFACTURER

- i. National flag shall be located between 3 to 3.5cm below from the shoulder line of the right arm.
- ii. NOC Code is a three-letter National Olympic Committee abbreviation, and it shall be printed at the back in black and centred at 5cm or higher from the bottom line of the upper garment within the size of 30cm width x 12cm height. The font of the letters shall be in bold "Verdana".
- iii. Manufacturer's identifications (name, designation trademark, logo or any distinctive sign of the manufacturer) shall be located one for the top of Kyorugi competition uniform within 30cm<sup>2</sup> and between 3 to 3.5cm below the shoulder line of the left arm, one for bottoms of Kyorugi competition uniform within 30cm<sup>2</sup> located above the knee and center of the right leg, and one for Kyorugi belt within 6cm<sup>2</sup> at the end of the belt.

## 24. SPONSOR'S IDENTIFICATION

- i. ONE sponsor's identification (logo) is allowed to each of Kyorugi competition uniform's top and bottoms.
- ii. The sponsor's identification shall be located within 50cm<sup>2</sup> except the location of WT logo, manufacturer's identification, national flag, and NOC code.

## 25. MEDICAL CONTROL

- i. The WT Anti-Doping Rules, and where necessary the Code of the World Anti-Doping Agency, shall apply throughout the competitions.
- ii. Compulsory anti-doping tests will be carried out for all medalists as well as random selection basis. The WT and/or WADA may carry out random out-of-competition testing prior to the competition.
- iii. TUE (Therapeutic Use Exemption)  
Athletes who take any substance or medicine listed in the "Prohibited List" of the WT Anti-Doping Rules and Anti-Doping Code of World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) for therapeutic purposes are requested to submit TUE applications via ADAMS, together with the required medical information. If you do not have an ADAMS account yet, please contact [tue@ita.sport](mailto:tue@ita.sport) to have it set up. Otherwise, please download the TUE Application Form [HERE](#) and once duly completed and signed, send it together with the required medical file to [tue@ita.sport](mailto:tue@ita.sport) with copy to [antidoping@worldtaekwondo.org](mailto:antidoping@worldtaekwondo.org), by at least 30 days before the first competition day. ## 26. HEAD OF TEAM MEETING

- i. The head of team meeting shall be conducted two (2) days prior to the start of the competition that is June 11<sup>th</sup>, in the presence of the WT officials and the representatives of the participating nations.
- ii. At least one representative from each team must attend the head of team meeting. In case of no representative can be at the meeting, the team must designate a proxy and inform Technical Delegate or WT Sport & Event Management Department before the meeting.

## 27. WEIGH-IN

- i. General weigh-in of the contestants shall take place on the day before their respective weight category.
- ii. Random weigh-in of the contestants shall take place in the morning on the competition day of their respective
- iii. weight category except M+80 & W+67. All contestants in draw must be presented
- iv. Random weigh-in shall apply to following number of contestants per each weight category with 5% allowance as below table.

- v. During the weigh-in, male contestants shall wear underpants and female contestants shall wear underpants and brassieres. However, contestants may weigh-in in the nude if they wish to do so.

## 28. INDEMNITIES

- i. All participants shall be responsible for own effective travel & medical insurance coverage.
- ii. Participants without proper insurance coverage will not be allowed to compete at the competition.
- iii. The Organizing Committee will acquire general Public Liability event insurance.

## 29. ACCOMMODATION & TRANSPORTATION

Participating teams are required to make reservation via link provided by the Organizing Committee - <https://taekwondo.fastbreaktravel.com/Event/7b5c/> by no later than April 25<sup>th</sup>, 2025. Both hotel information and reservation is available in the link.

Accommodation must be secured by participating athletes and teams, and is not subject to any refund after the given period mentioned in the reservation link.

## 30. VISA INFORMATION

The Organizing Committee can provide Visa invitation letters for visa applications.

However, MNAs are required to check the USA entry visa application waiting times in their own countries and submit requests for recommendation letters to the organizing committee. The Organizing Committee





cannot guarantee entry into the United States and can only offer assistance.

Visa invitation letter is available for the registered participants upon registration, and it is the responsibility of each athlete and MNA to apply for and secure the correct entry visa for the United States.

The guideline on the Visa application will be provided by the Organizing Committee, and can be found in both WT website and GMS/Simplycompete for participants.

### **31. COACH'S REQUIREMENTS**

All coaches are required to hold **WT Coach Certificate Level II (2)**. Coaches those do not hold Level II coach certificate will be deleted from the registration and not allowed to coach.

All coaches are required to wear formal suit such as tie, jacket, dress shirt (long or short), trousers, and sport shoes during Semi-Finals and Finals. If any coach refuses to wear abovementioned attire, he or she will not be allowed to coach for Charlotte 2025 World Taekwondo GP Challenge as well as Muju Taekwondowon 2025 World Taekwondo GP Challenge.

### **32. TEAM DOCTOR'S MEETING**

In order to receive accreditation card, all registered team medical staff must attend team doctor's meeting on June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
